

## Wyoming Antelope Club Range Rules



### General Rules

1. No shooting is permitted on any range unless there is a Range Officer present and in control.
2. Ear and eye protection are *mandatory* for anyone on the concrete pad when the line is “hot”.
3. Persons not firing shall not be on the firing line (except for spotters, coaches and adults supervising minors).
4. All persons under the age of 18 require immediate adult supervision at our range. The supervising adult must be within arm’s length of the shooter and not be shooting in another position. If a minor is firing a rifle or handgun even with immediate adult supervision, it will be the Range Officer’s final decision as to whether that minor has the experience necessary to fire that firearm. If not, the Range Officer may stop them from shooting. Note: there is no minimum age for shooting at our range.
5. The muzzles of all firearms must be pointed in a safe direction at all times.
6. No persons may go forward of the concrete pad/firing line during the period the line is deemed “hot”.
7. Bulk amounts of black powder are not to be brought to the line. Flasks and horns must be filled in the parking lot.
8. No rapid or uncontrolled fire as judged by the Range Officer.
9. Any firearm deemed “unsafe to fire” by Range Officer shall not be fired.
10. Absolutely no alcohol is allowed on the range. This includes any person under the influence of alcohol. (Alcohol is allowed only within the clubhouse.)
11. No smoking in front of the yellow line.
12. Any person exhibiting a lack of due care or proficiency will be immediately ordered to cease fire.
13. No guns are allowed to be put out for sale at any of our ranges.
14. No civilian shall wear a holstered handgun (with the exception of specific action pistol events and uniformed law enforcement).
15. No human silhouette targets shall be used during club operating hours.
16. Only one paper target is allowed per frame. (Multiple bull’s eye target permissible.)
17. Purposeful destruction of frames or facilities will **NOT** be tolerated. A penalty of \$25.00 will be assessed for purposeful destruction of club facilities.

### The Range Officer’s Decision is Final

18. No exploding targets or tracer ammunition is allowed.
19. Shooters may only retrieve their brass.

### Firearms

1. A firearm is considered “safe” if encased or if unloaded with the magazine removed and action or cylinder open in such a manner as to make it physically impossible to fire.
2. Firearms must be brought to the firing line in a “safe” and only when the line is “hot”.
3. All uncased firearms shall be transported to and from the line “safe” and with the muzzle pointed skyward.
4. All firearms must be fired from the bench on the 100 yard line.
5. All firearms must be “safe” and shall not be handled during the periods that the line is called “cold” and persons are down range.
6. All unattended firearms on the line shall be left “safe” with the actions open, magazines out and chambers empty or left encased.
7. Calibers up to but NOT including 50 caliber BMG are allowed.
8. Firearms “going automatic” shall be made safe and removed from the range.

### Public Range Rifle Rules

1. All centerfire rifles shall be loaded one round at a time. Members with identification may load up to 5 rounds at a time on 25 yard, 50 yard, and plinking pit.
2. Rimfire rifles may load up to ten rounds (maximum).
3. All centerfire rifles must be fired from the bench; no off-hand shooting.
4. Rimfire rifles may be fired from the bench or off-hand. (Exception – Bench only on the 100 yard range.)
5. Muzzle loader/black power rifles may be fired from the bench or off-hand. (Exception – Bench only on the 100 yard range.)
6. The function of a rifle with multiple rounds may be tested if under the direct supervision of a Range Officer. The rifle must be in safe operating condition and previously sighted in.
7. All firearms with centerfire rifle cartridges must be shot from the bench. Exception; revolver handguns

### Public Range Pistol Rules

1. Handguns may load up to ten rounds (maximum).
2. Pistols chambered for rifle cartridges shall only be shot from the bench at all positions.

### Public Range Shotgun Rules

1. Shotguns with slugs will be treated as centerfire rifles; that is, single round loading and from the bench only.
2. Shotguns fired with shot shells may be patterned under Range Officer control and direction. Patterning may be done on the 25 yard line or on one of the satellite ranges. Shotguns must be fired from the bench. See Range Officer for details.

### Class 3

1. NO AUTOMATIC FIREARMS OF ANY KIND.
2. Some class 3 firearms and devices may be fired with proof of license. See range officer for details.
